Do you remember when Barbara Dowding, National Past President, added to the 2014 to 2016 theme *One Heart, One Voice, One Mission: Palliative and Hospice Care?*

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's mandate in his letter to Dr. Philpott, Federal Minister of Health, was to "support delivery of more and better health care services. This includes more access to high quality caregivers, financial supports for family care, and when necessary, palliative care;" (p.m.gc.ca/eng/ministerial-mandate-letters). At the 2016 National Convention the 2016.04 Resolution was passed, Amending the Canada Health Act to identify Palliative Care as insured Health Service.

***Note: As of August 29 The Honorable Ginette Taylor is now the Federal Minister of Health.**

What can we do?

- Designate a day in May to 12 Hours of Prayer for Palliative Care.
- Write letters to Honorable Ginette Taylor, Federal Minister of Health and Provincial Minister of Health, Honorable Jim Reiter.
- Pray, pray, pray. Ask your elderly members to pray for this amendment.
