This program will be open to all Canadian Catholic women 21+ years of age, of all backgrounds and experiences. Participants will have an opportunity to explore:

- 3. Conflict resolution
- 4. Media training and communication skills.

Led by Catholic educators, women will participate in a program that offers: A five-day residency, a year-long online component, a three day closing residency and retreat and ongoing mentorship and networking.
