Good Morning, Ladies, Rev. Doan and Rev. Fiolleau:

- The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be ongoing in the morning.

St. Laurent Shrine - Our Lady of Lourdes – Duck Lake

Inspired by the shrine at Lourdes, France, the St. Laurent Shrine was erected in 1879 through the efforts of Fr. Fourmond and Brother Piquet. Log church constructed 1995. Located along the South Saskatchewan River. 12 km directly E of Duck Lake on grid road; alternate road at statue landmark on Hwy 11, approximately 5 km NE of Duck Lake. Latitude: 52.83031° N, Longitude: -106.1002° W

- Free admission. Country/rural setting. Wheelchair access.
- Shrine open May to September. Self-guided tour and guided tour upon request.
- Museum/information centre open end of June to August 31. Religious items for sale. Gift shop. Modern washroom. Picnic area.
- Novena July 7 14 at 7:30 p.m.
- Annual pilgrimages July 15/16, August 15 and Virgin Mary's birthday on September 8. Food will be available on pilgrimage dates.
