Dignity & Rights of Persons: I encourage you to read or re-read the Universal Declaration of Human Rights document. This eight page document contains 30 Articles or statements detailing rights we are universally entitled to. Please consider studying and discussing one or two of these articles at your council meetings as part of your monthly Community Life convener's report. On a provincial level our Premier has taken an important stride. In January Premier Scott Moe apologized to the survivors of the Saskatchewan Sixties Scoop. Social & Economic Justice: The National CWL 100 Year Centennial Committee has launched a special national project called H.U.G. Packages for 2019. H.U.G stands for Helping, Understanding, Giving. The goal of this project is to assemble and distribute 2,109 H.U.G. Packages to local women's shelters. All councils are encouraged to fill a small bag, purse or tote with toiletries, clothing items, socks, slippers, baby or children's items, and a gift card or two for a local grocery or general store. Women and children seeking refuge often arrive with only the clothing on their backs. A H.U.G. Package from a local council would provide them with immediate creature comforts and the means to purchase necessary items in a time of distress.

New CWL National Theme – Care for our Common Home. The new theme logo and PowerPoint have been posted to the national website. More information arrived in the winter edition of the League magazine. This theme resonates with me as it follows in the footsteps of the theme we are finishing and speaks to the concerns of Community Life. There is a need for study, awareness and immediate action to reduce the impact of human endeavors on the climate. The excerpts below are direct quotes from the Care for our Common Home PowerPoint:

"The cry of the earth and the cry of the poor are one and the same."

World Peace Initiative. In December 2018 the CCCB (Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops) representing all 26 denominations of The Canadian Council of Churches wrote a joint letter to the Prime Minister of Canada urging that the Government of Canada support the United Nations Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons. The CCCB denounces the use and proliferation of nuclear weapons stating "Nuclear arsenals cannot defend against attack nor protect humanity or any part of God's Creation. "
